



## SPIDER TREATMENT PREPARATIONS

**NOTE: These items must be completed prior to service or the technician may not perform service and a service charge will be applied.**

1. Pick up all loose “clutter” inside of the home to maximize the floor surface areas. This may include but is not limited to: boxes, clothing, children’s toys, books, magazines, exercise equipment, pet dishes, etc. You may place these items up on counters, tables, chairs or furniture.
2. Damp mop any and all solid floor surfaces such as tile, hardwood flooring, linoleum or concrete. Pay particular attention to edges such as baseboards and around corners.
3. Vacuum all carpeted floor surfaces and make sure to include out of the way areas such as under furniture (couches, overstuffed chairs, recliners, ottomans, etc.) and behind difficult to reach areas such as behind credenzas, desks, tables, chairs, curios, dressers, cabinets etc.
4. Remove all items from under beds and in bedroom closets and place items up on the bed. Thoroughly vacuum these areas especially in cracks and crevices.
5. Vacuum around and behind all appliances such as hot water tanks, washer, dryer, refrigerator, freezer, whether in the home or inside the garage or basement.
6. Trim away any tree branches or shrubbery from the outside roof area or exterior siding by at least 6 inches. Move any stacked firewood away from the exterior siding by at least 6 inches.
7. Check all exterior entrances to make sure there are no gaps under any of the doors. If there are gaps, install necessary threshold or door sweeps to prevent access to ground crawling insects.

People and pets will be required to vacate once the technician begins to treat and will be required to remain out of the structure for a minimum of 4 hours to let the products dry. Upon return, you may notice a slight increase in the number of spiders being flushed out for a few days before they die, this is perfectly normal. Please make sure all of these preparations have been completed by the time the technician arrives or he may not be able to perform the treatment.
